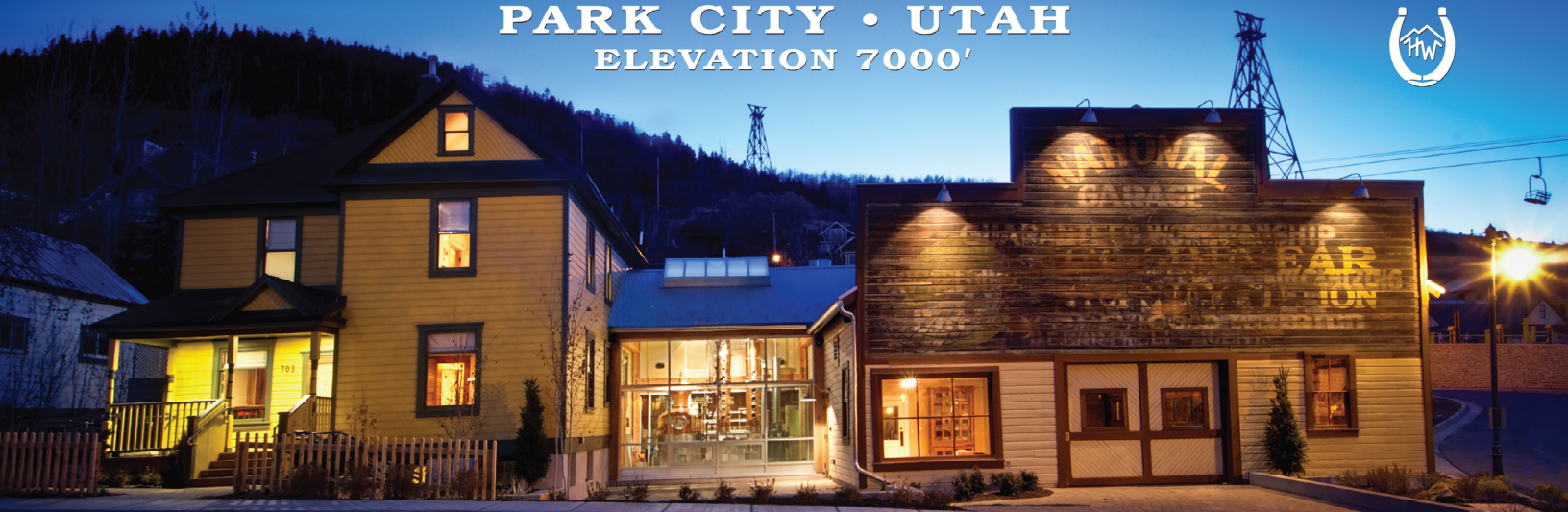


# HIGH WEST DISTILLERY AND SALOON

High West Distillery & Saloon is Utah's first legal distillery since 1870 and the world's only Ski-in Gastro-distillery located at exactly 7000' in the heart of Old Town Park City. High West's passion is crafting delicious whiskeys and marrying these with contemporary Western comfort food. We think our whiskey is pretty good...but don't take our word for it...High West Whiskeys have received multiple awards and accolades and High West Distillery was named 2011 "Whiskey Pioneer of the Year" by Whiskey Advocate, America's leading whiskey magazine. High West was started by David Perkins, a former biochemist with a passion for cooking and the American West. David decided to leave his job in the biotech industry and start a distillery to make a western whiskey. It didn't hurt that Jane, David's wife, had a great grandfather who started one of the country's leading distilleries turn of the century 1900. In 2007, after navigating Utah's complex licensing process, David's dream came true and High West Distillery opened for business.

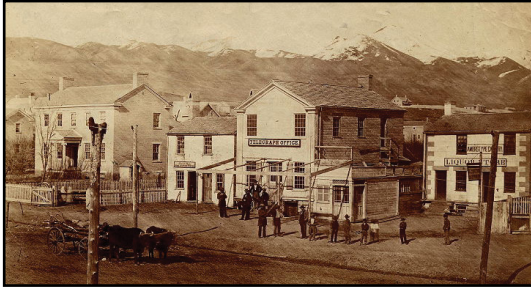


# UTAH DISTILLED SPIRITS HISTORY

Utah has a fascinating distilled spirits history - High West is proud to be the latest chapter.

**1826 - Mountain Man Rendezvous** - The first recorded whiskey-fest out West happens in Cache County Utah.

**1857 - Salt Lake City has a Whiskey Street** - Main Street, between 2nd and 3rd South (see photo).



**1860's - Mark Twain and explorer Capt. Richard Burton sample Valley Tan** - Twain calls it, "The exclusive Mormon refresher... made of imported fire and brimstone."

**1870 - Last known legal still in Utah**

**1884 - Park City incorporated** - Miners create Utah's best "watering hole."

**1933 - Utah provides 36th vote to end Prohibition** - "No other state shall take away this glory from Utah."

**2007 - High West Distillery opens** - Distilling returns to Utah. Yippee ki-yay!

## ABOUT OUR HOME

Our home is listed on the National Historic Register and both buildings are important examples of Park City's early architecture during the mining period. A brief history:

### ELLSWORTH J. BEGGS HOUSE

The house was built in 1914 and is architecturally significant as one of only a few two-story Victorian style pyramid houses in Park City. The October 3, 1914 issue of the Park Record reported: "E.J. Beggs, the well known mill and carpenter, has pulled down his old home on lower Park Ave. and will erect on the site a modern 8 room, two story

house. Mr. Beggs has one of the finest building lots in the city and a two-story house will set it off splendidly." Ellsworth J. Beggs, a master carpenter, had just built the Summit County Courthouse in Coalville so a high quality home could be expected. Burnis and Betty Watts purchased the house in 1974 and lived in it until the City purchased it in 1997.

### NATIONAL GARAGE

The National Garage was originally a livery stable to service the workhorses that pulled the heavy ore carts to the mines. During renovation we found a horseshoe and knew we had to make that our logo. Beggs rebuilt a smaller livery stable c 1906 for his "Beggs and Buckley Livery". As automobiles became popular, the partners began servicing cars, changing the name to Beggs and Buckley Garage. Local sign painter Roy Fletcher painted the original National Garage sign. Later, when the business became the Sinclair Park Motor, Fletcher painted the sign as well. The garage business operated until 1942. When the Silver King Coalition Mines Company building burned down in 1981, the heat was so intense it melted the paint away from several layers of re-painted signs to what you can see today.
